Extra-Curricular Items and Activities	Amount
Instrumental Music Lessons – Reservoir High offer weekly lessons with a large variety of instruments, Information and forms can be collected from General office	\$200.00
Printing Vouchers – Printing vouchers can be collected from the General office	\$20.00
Combination Padlock – Should be retained from year 7, can be purchased from the General office	\$20.00
Art creative practice - Students practical folio will be based on a variety of styles and techniques and may include media such as pastel, charcoal, different types of paint, pen and ink.	\$60.00
Digital Technologies - Learn how to program games, working collaboratively to design, create, and evaluate a solution. Build understanding of the role of Networking and how they manage, control and secure the movement of and access to data.	\$20.00
Food Technology - Students will investigate the influences on Australian cuisine and the future of food. In a combination of practical and theory classes the topics explored will include Australian Indigenous Foods, the importance of accurate sensory analysis and the Design Process.	\$75.00

Health & Human development – Students explore the different aspects of health and wellbeing. They will learn about factors that influence health, such as biological, sociocultural, and environmental influences, and how these factors affect individuals and communities. Students will also examine health in both Australian and global contexts, gaining an understanding of how various conditions and healthcare systems impact health outcomes.	\$40.00
Language study – Chinese – Studying Chinese provides access to a rich cultural heritage and deepens your understanding of global history and traditions. It enhances career prospects in fields such as international business and diplomacy. Additionally, learning Chinese improves cognitive skills like memory and problem-solving and offers a unique perspective on language structure and communication.	\$45.00
Music – Students get the opportunity to learn a variety of instruments such as guitar, piano, voice, cello, violin, trumpet, saxophone and flute. Students will further develop their skills in reading music notation and ear training, replacing/updating equipment and mouthpiece for each student.	\$80.00
Outdoor education - In this study, both passive and active outdoor experiences provide essential means for students to develop experiential knowledge of outdoor environments. Such knowledge is then enhanced through the study of outdoor environments from perspectives of environmental history, ecology and the social studies of human relationships with nature. The duration of activities undertaken will include a range of multi-day/journey-based activities, half/whole-day activities and class-time activities on school campus grounds, or in the nearby local environment. Physical Education – Students will further improve skill level, fitness and sporting tactics with a wide variety of moderate to high intensity sports or specialize in activities of interest such as weight training	\$40.00
Physical Education & Health – Students will further improve skill level, fitness and sporting tactics with a wide variety of moderate to high intensity sports or specialize in activities of interest such as weight training	\$35.00
Product Design & Technologies – Students learn a range of drawing techniques and develop them into technically drawn plans. They will develop their skills using a range of tools, machinery, process and techniques to safely manufacture/produce a prototype designed in their portfolio	\$60.00
Systems engineering & Robotics – Making things move, is the basic study of Mechanisms and Integrated Circuitry that enable the student to design and build a moving vehicle.	\$60.00
