Instrumental Music Lessons Group – Reservoir High offer weekly lessons with a large variety of instruments, Information and forms can be collected from General office	\$400.00
Instrumental Music Lessons Individual – Reservoir High offer weekly lessons with a large variety of instruments, Information and forms can be collected from General office	\$600.00

Art – Students dive into a world of creativity and exploration with a diverse range of artistic mediums, including DSLR photography, drawing, painting, ceramics, spray paint, digital art, and mixed media. Discover captivating topics and themes such as Street Art, the surreal realms of dreams and nightmares, and the rich symbolism of self-expression.	\$65.00
Digital Technologies – Students develop computational thinking and programming skills by learning how to decompose problems, recognise patterns, and create algorithms to solve problems using flow charts and pseudocode. Learn how to program games, working collaboratively to design, create, and evaluate a solution. Build understanding of the role of Networking and how they manage, control and secure the movement of and access to data.	\$25.00



Food Technology - Students will investigate the influences on Australian cuisine and the future of food. In a combination of practical and theory classes the topics explored will include Australian Indigenous Foods, the importance of accurate sensory analysis and the Design Process.	\$80.00
Health & Human development – Students will learn about factors that influence health, such as biological, sociocultural, and environmental influences, and how these factors affect individuals and communities. Students will also examine health in both Australian and global contexts, gaining an understanding of how various conditions and healthcare systems impact health outcomes.	\$45.00
Media – Students with an interest in analysing and producing a range of media forms. Students will explore how elements like structure, characters, settings, and genre are used in film, photography, advertising, and digital media to tell stories or express ideas. Students will also learn how techniques like sound, lighting, time, space and movement can shape meaning.	\$25.00
Outdoor education - This course will help you understand the relationship between humans and nature, the importance of preserving outdoor environments, and how to safely and sustainably enjoy these spaces. You'll participate in excursions including some of the following: hiking, high ropes, and camping skills, and explore a variety of outdoor settings from local parks to national parks Excursion \$200.00	\$45.00
Physical Education – Students explore how the human body moves and performs in physical activities. This includes understanding how muscles, bones, and the cardiorespiratory systems work together during exercise. Students will learn about the impact of social, cultural, and environmental factors on physical activity and sport.	\$35.00
Physical Education & Health – They will use reliable health information to make informed decisions and propose solutions for issues at home, school, and in the community. Students will also develop and assess ways to improve fitness and physical activity in their communities	\$40.00
Systems engineering & Robotics – Students consider the role of robots in society and the positive and negative aspects of using them. Learn about programming in general and use a programmed robot to complete a diverse range of game challenges. Learn 3D modelling, 3D printing and laser cutting	\$70.00
Visual communication design — Students that are interested in drawing, designing and communicating, researching and solving design problems. Students will develop creative and innovative ways to communicate ideas and information, and to solve human-design problems. Develop an understanding for and application of good design practices, research methods, and design critique. Explore four fields of design: Messages, Objects, Environments, and Interactive Experiences. Build respect for and acknowledgement of the diverse roles and practices of designers, and the cultural context of visual communication design.	\$65.00
